# Campbell Junior Basketball Program Parent and Player Contract 2025-2026 Basketball Season

Congratulations on your acceptance into the Campbell Junior Basketball program. For those new to our program, please note that participation requires a high level of commitment and is highly competitive and time-intensive. The season extends from now through approximately March, with tournaments scheduled during school breaks, including but not limited to Christmas and Martin Luther King Jr. holidays. Tournament participation will be determined at the discretion of that team coaching staff.

The goal of this program is to provide student-athletes with a solid foundation in basketball fundamentals and to prepare them for future participation on the Campbell High School team. If you intend to play for another school, we kindly request you do not take a roster spot that could otherwise benefit a prospective Campbell player.

## **Important Dates:**

- Parent Meeting: 09/13/25 (Time and location TBA, Campbell High, Gwyn/McClure gym, 12:00 noon)
- Fees and Certification Due: On or before 09/13/25
- Installment plan available: 1<sup>st</sup>- \$171 due 09/13/25, 2<sup>nd</sup> \$171 due 10/18/25, 3<sup>rd</sup> \$171 due 11/15/25, and final payment due 12/13/25 of \$162

### Team Rules & Guidelines:

• Fees: The program fee for 2025–2026 is \$675 per player. Preferred payment method is #Cashapp (\$CampbellJrBasketball); checks are also accepted. Please do not send cash. The fee covers training, tournament costs, program overhead, end-of-season banquet, uniform, equipment, etc. All coaches serve as unpaid volunteers. A timely fee payment is expected, beginning after final team selections. Payments should be coordinated with your designated team parent to ensure proper credit. A GoFundMe page is available for assistance with fees.

For CCJBC certification, all forms, documents, and payments must be submitted in full. Teams fielding uncertified players risk forfeiting games; only certified players will be included on official rosters.

- **Uniforms:** Players are responsible for their own uniforms once distributed. Replacements for lost or damaged uniforms are the responsibility of the player and may cost up to \$100. Please bring a change of clothes for after your final game of the season. Based on coach preference, athletes may be required to return uniforms to the team parent after each game.
- Grades: Maintaining good academic standing is required. <u>Student Athletes</u> must submit progress, or report
  cards each grading period. The program prioritizes academics, utilizing measures such as additional drills,
  suspension, or dismissal to address academic concerns.
- Playing Time: Playing time is earned based on performance, attitude, and attendance at practice; it is not guaranteed nor always distributed evenly. Decisions regarding playing time rest solely with the coaching staff. Should there be any concerns, <a href="Student Athletes">Student Athletes</a> are expected to speak directly with their head coach prior to parental involvement. Practice attendance is restricted to the designated team parent and one rotating parent; general attendance is not encouraged.
- Attendance: Prompt attendance at every practice is mandatory (arrive at least five minutes early).
   Communicate any conflicts directly with your coach. Excessive absences may result in dismissal from the team.

# • Excused Absences include:

- Contagious illness (for other minor ailments or injuries, attendance is still required to observe practice) or Coaches decision.
- Official school activities (e.g., concerts, awards ceremonies)

- Exceptional circumstances (e.g., family bereavement, serious illness)
- Participation in other sports (permitted until completion of the fall sport season; regular attendance then resumes)
- **Games:** Parents are expected to support the program by scheduling around practice and game times. Punctual arrival is required (45–60 minutes prior to start time, as directed by your coach); lateness may affect playing time at the coach's discretion. Sideline decorum is strictly enforced—disrespectful behavior towards officials will lead to removal from the premises.
- Misconduct: The program enforces a strict code of conduct for both players and parents:
  - Disrespect, bullying, fighting, and inappropriate language will not be tolerated.
  - Parental misconduct, whether between Campbell families or with opposing teams, can result in
    ejection from the facility, escalating to suspension or dismissal on repeated offenses. Local authorities
    may be contacted if necessary.
- **Communication:** Clear, respectful communication is essential. Direct routine inquiries to the team parent. For issues requiring coaching staff attention, email contact is preferred. Discussions related to playing time or strategy should not occur before, during, or after games.

All participants are expected to comply with this contract. Non-adherence may result in removal from the program without refund.
